ELIGIBILITY FOR ENTRY

It should be noted that entries will be strictly confined to the Show Area. The show is confined to the area embraced by the former Atholl, Aberfeldy and Killin branches of the National Farmers Union of Scotland. This means that competitors must have a residence within the show area and the animal(s) must be kept within the show area at all times, with the exception of Highland Ponies (Classes 1-9 inclusive) and Clydesdale Horses (Classes 11-18 inclusive) for which entry from outside the area will be by invitation of the committee.

THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ADHERED TO BY THE ORGANISERS AND ENTRIES OUTWITH THE AREA WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED, EITHER ON PAPER OR ON THE DAY.

GUIDELINES FOR HORSE & PONY COMPETITORS

Hard hats should be worn when loading/unloading and **MUST BE WORN** at all times when mounted. Hats must conform to PAS015, ASTM F1163 or EN1384 with a kitemark or SEI. Extreme care must be used when mounted outside of the competition rings. No cantering. Control of the Horse or Pony should be maintained at all times.

Competitors will be excluded from taking part in competition if adequate control is not maintained.

Riders must behave in a courteous and safety conscious manner towards officials and spectators at all times.

MRS LEARMONTH TROPHY presented by Mrs Y. Learmonth for Best Horse or Pony from Classes 2,3,5A,5B and 6.

THE COSHIEVILLE CUP presented by Mr D. Harkness for the Best Rider judged from Classes 18a and 18b

THE RYDER TROPHY presented by Mr & Mrs A Ryder & Family for the Best Team of Three Lightlegged Horses or Ponies (Class 7)

THE MAJOR NESS CUP presented by the late Major Parker Ness, Letterellen, Fearnan for the Overall Winner of Classes 8,9,10 & 11).

THE FISHERS ROSEBOWL presented by Provost Hamish Fisher for the Overall Championship judged from the Winner of the Mrs Learmonth Trophy and the Winner of the Major Ness Cup.

THE MRS CAMPBELL PRESTON TROPHY presented by the late Mrs Campbell Preston of Blair Castle (Overall Winner of Classes 15,16 & 17).

NOTES FOR HORSE & PONY EXHIBITORS: -

Attention is drawn to the “ELEGIBILITY OF ENTRY” paragraph on Page 2.

Passports must be produced when collecting rider numbers.

Guidelines for Turnout in Mountain & Moorland ridden classes: -

- Bridles should be plain and workmanlike.
- Plain browband – metal or clincher are permitted but some judges don’t like them (NB: brass was traditionally for stallions)
- Either no numnah or one which is discreet and matches the horse and saddle
- No boots or bandages
- Brown or black tack – brown is preferred by traditional judges and is always correct in the show ring
- Snaffle bridle for novice classes
- Double bridle or pelham for open classes
- Straight cut or working hunter saddles show more of the horse’s shoulder and movement, so are preferable to GP saddles
- Manes, tails and feathers may be pulled/trimmed in some breeds, according to the breed society’s specifications
- Quarter markers are not correct for native ponies

Entry is £2.50 per class - £3.00 if entered on the field

Judging commences at 9.00am prompt.

Classes 1, 1a, 1b & 1c will be judged in Rings 1 & 2 followed by Class 2 in Ring 1 and Class 8 in Ring 2

Judges: -

Ridden - Ms M Flynn, Idvies, Forfar

Working Hunter - Mr J Maxwell, Roy Bridge, Inverness-shire

Fancy Dress - Ms S Smith, RDA Centre, Bannockburn

- Class 1 Best Turnout 12.2hh and under, to be ridden by child 12 years and under.
- Class 1a Best Turnout exceeding 12.2hh and not exceeding 13.2hh
- Class 1b Best Turnout exceeding 13.2hh and not exceeding 14.2hh
- Class 1c Best Turnout exceeding 14.2hh
- Class 2 Lead Rein Pony under 12.0hh to be ridden by child 8 years old or under.
- Class 3 Ridden Pony 12.2hh and under to be ridden by child 12 years old or under.
Under no circumstances may the same Pony & Rider be entered in classes 2 and 3
- Class 4 Child Handler Class – for children under the age of 10 years and ponies 12.2hh and under.
Children will be asked to lead ponies at walk and trot, lift their pony's feet and generally demonstrate to the Judge that they are competent handlers of their ponies.
- Class 5a Ridden Pony exceeding 13.2hh but not exceeding 14.2hh.
(Highland Ponies exempt) Rider to be 18 years or under.
- Class 5b Ridden Pony exceeding 12.2hh but not exceeding 13.2hh.
Rider to be 16 years or under.
- Class 6 Ridden Horse or Pony exceeding 14.0hh
Under no circumstances may the same Horse/Pony & Rider be entered in classes 5a and 6
- Class 7 Best team of Three Ridden Horses or Ponies
N.B. Highland Ponies are exempted from this class, as they will be able to compete in the "Team of Three Highlands" on Saturday 14th August.

- Class 8 Working Hunter over 14.0hh.
- Class 9 Working Hunter exceeding 13.2hh but not exceeding 14.2hh.
Rider to be 18 years or under.
- Class 10 Working Hunter exceeding 12.2hh but not exceeding 13.2hh.
Rider to be 16 years or under.
- Class 11 Working Hunter 12.2hh and under.
Rider to be 12 years or under.
Under no circumstances may the same Horse/Pony & Rider be entered in classes 8 and 9.
Competitors in Classes 8, 9, 10, 11 will be asked to negotiate approximately SIX obstacles.
- Class 12 Nursery Stakes – lead Rein Jumping for children 8 years old and under,
riding ponies 12.2hh and under.
Competitors in class 12 will be asked to negotiate approximately SIX obstacles on a lead rein.
Under no circumstances may the same Horse/Pony & Rider be entered in classes 11 and 12.
- Class 13 Fancy Dress - “Winter Olympics”
If sufficient entries, classes may be grouped by age.
- Class 14 Lead Rein Games for ponies not exceeding 12.2hh and children 8 years
old and under.
Special prizes for 1st, 2nd & 3rd with Special Rosettes for all competitors.
- Class 15 Games for Ponies exceeding 12.2hh but not exceeding 13.2hh.
- Class 16 Games for Ponies exceeding 13.2hh but not exceeding 14.2hh
- Class 17 Games for Ponies 12.2hh and under.
- Class 18a Coshieville Cup - Best Rider aged 10 to 12 years
- Class 18b Coshieville Cup - Best Rider aged 13 to 16 years
