It should be noted that entries will be strictly confined to the Show Area The show is confined to the area embraced by the former Atholl, Aberfeldy and Killin branches of the National Farmers Union of Scotland. This means that competitors must have a residence within the show area and the animal(s) must be kept within the show area at all times, with the exception of Highland Ponies (Classes 1-9 inclusive) and Clydesdale Horses (Classes 11-18 inclusive) for which entry from outside the area will be by invitation of the committee. **THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ADHERED TO BY THE ORGANISERS AND ENTRIES OUTWITH THE AREA WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED, EITHER ON PAPER OR ON THE DAY.**

## GUIDELINES FOR HORSE & PONY COMPETITORS

Hard hats should be worn when loading/unloading and **MUST BE WORN** at all times when mounted. Hats must conform to PAS015, ASTM F1163 or EN1384 with a kitemark or SEI.

Extreme care must be used when mounted outside of the competition rings. No cantering.

Control of the Horse or Pony should be maintained at all times.

**Competitors will be excluded from taking part in competition if adequate control is not maintained.**

Riders must behave in a courteous and safety conscious manner towards officials and spectators at all times.

### **NOTES FOR HORSE & PONY EXHIBITORS: -**

Attention is drawn to the “ELEGIBILITY OF ENTRY” paragraph on Page 2.

Passports must be produced when collecting rider numbers.

Guidelines for Turnout in Mountain & Moorland ridden classes: -

- Bridles should be plain and workmanlike.
- Plain browband – metal or clincher are permitted but some judges don't like them (NB: brass was traditionally for stallions)
- Either no numnah or one which is discreet and matches the horse and saddle
- No boots or bandages
- Brown or black tack – brown is preferred by traditional judges and is always correct in the show ring
- Snaffle bridle for novice classes
- Double bridle or pelham for open classes
- Straight cut or working hunter saddles show more of the horse's shoulder and movement, so are preferable to GP saddles
- Manes, tails and feathers may be pulled/trimmed in some breeds, according to the breed society's specifications
- Quarter markers are not correct for native ponies
- Either no numnah or one which is discreet and matches the horse and saddle
- No boots or bandages
- Brown or black tack – brown is preferred by traditional judges and is always correct in the show ring
- Snaffle bridle for novice classes
- Double bridle or pelham for open classes
- Straight cut or working hunter saddles show more of the horse's shoulder and movement, so are preferable to GP saddles

3. Attendants must remain in close attendance of their stock in the showyard.
4. Horse and Pony exhibitors, when showing animals in the judging ring and on parade, must wear number tickets.
5. Admission tickets to showyard will be issued to stock attendants on following basis – Cattle classes – up to three entries, one ticket; up to six entries, two tickets; over six entries, three tickets – Sheep classes – one entry, one ticket; up to four entries, two tickets; up to eight entries, three tickets; over eight entries, four tickets.
6. In case of inclement weather, the Committee reserves the right to withhold part or the whole of the Show.
7. No animal may leave the showyard unless by permission of the Committee.
8. The decision of the judges in all cases of dispute shall be final.
9. All animals shown, except where otherwise stated, must be at the time of entry *bona-fide* property of the exhibitor(s) in whose name they are entered, and must, except in the case of horses and sheep have been on the farm(s) from which entered for a period of not less than three months prior to the date of the Show.
10. No animal shall be eligible to compete for a prize or trophy against any other animal which has previously been placed above it in a competition on the same day at the Atholl and Breadalbane Show. Any dispute on this point to be referred to the Committee before decision.
11. In the event of any of the Livestock Classes attracting only one entry, the prize money in that class will be the value of the second prize.
12. The Committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage whatsoever and entries are only accepted on this condition.
13. Straw is not permitted in the showyard.
